





The awards ceremony is the culmination of the festival, and it is wonderful to see the artists rewarded for their creativity and dedication to their artistic vision. Artists awards are presented in the following categories: Best of Category – ceramics, drawing/pastells/printmaking, fiber/leather, glass, jewelry, mixed media 2d, mixed media 3d, painting, photography, sculpture and wood, and Best of Show.

In order to maintain a fresh perspective the judges change from year to year. Winning artists are extended an invitation to participate in next year's show.

The Festival of Arts is able to maintain a high caliber of art in our show because it is juried, meaning that as part of the selection process artists must submit examples of their work, which is reviewed anonymously by an independent jury. Again, the jury changes from year to year. We are fortunate to have an abundance of talented and generous artists to serve as jurors and judges for the Festival.

Another important part of the Awards ceremony is the presentation of scholarships. Each year high school students attending Oconomowoc schools or residing in the district are given the opportunity to compete for several scholarships. Over the past 50 years, the Festival of the Arts has awarded over \$200,000 in scholarships to students intending to pursue careers in the arts.

2023 Cover Artist Thomas Tyers

This years 2023 Oconomowoc Festival of the Arts cover was created by Thomas Tyers who received the 2023 Oconomowoc Festival of the Arts Award in his category of wood. Thomas is a native of Oshkosh, now living in Omro, Wisconsin. He has been carving wildfowl for 50 years. His work now tries to skillfully display just one feather, butterfly, or the colorful beauty of feather compositions. His art pieces are carved from Basswood and painted in acrylics using various techniques.

Throughout his career, he has won over 200 awards in the United States and Canada. Thomas has done over 1000 pieces in his time as a carver, starting with miniature decoys given as gifts to family and friends to full size birds such as Red-Tailed Hawks and Snowy Egrets.

Thomas learned to carve from Oshkosh native John Ryan who was taught by Frank Strey, who was a famous Lake Winnebago decoy carver. In 1991 and 2016 he was featured along with the works of John James Audubon at the Paine Art Center of Oshkosh. His works are in the collections of President Jimmy Carter, Dr. Jane Goodall, and Dr George Archibald.

Stephen Perkins

Recent activities include a one-person exhibition at the Watrous Gallery in Madison titled Stephen Perkins: Mining the Archive: Subspace Works and Artists' Accordion Books, February 10 – April 9, 2023.

Lillian Sizemore

Lillian Sizemore pursued a life-long career in the arts after graduating in Fine Art, Printmaking, and Italian at Indiana University-Bloomington in 1980. She works across disciplines from graphic design and photography, to mosaic and arts administration. Her writing has been published in RawVision, Wisconsin People & Ideas, and Mosaïque, among others.

She lived for 25 years in San Francisco, where she began researching the twentieth century mosaic movement employing her expertise as a maker with a passion for mosaic in the built environment. She taught at the Institute of Mosaic Art in Oakland, and from 2013-2016 she lived in London pursuing further arts research at The Prince's Foundation School of Traditional Arts.
